**Hugh L. Brady, FF, JD**, serves as the general counsel for the White House Office of Administration and is a clinical professor of law at The University of Texas (on leave). He is a Fellow of FIAV, a past president of the Association, a director of The Flag Research Center, and the vice president of the Vexillological Association of the State of Texas (VAST).

**Lieutenant-Colonel David W. Grebstad, MA, MDS**, is a serving Artillery officer in the Canadian Armed Forces.
